













A teacher in an Islamic school explains the five pillars of Islam to students, and these pillars are the most important Islamic teachings that a Muslim must do, these are: the testimony that there is no god but Allah and that Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah, the five daily prayers, Zakat, fasting, and the pilgrimage to Mecca.
